Driving Directions from Hollidaysburg via Martinsburg

- ▶ Allow AT LEAST 1 HOUR to drive the 41 miles (thru numerous small towns & park).
- ► Take Rt 36 South from Hollidaysburg (Penn St) across Catfish Ridge to Roaring Spring.
- ▶ At signal light at top of hill (Turkey Hill gas station on right) TURN LEFT onto Rt 164 East and go thru Martinsburg and across the mountain.
- ▶ At foot of other side of the mountain, turn LEFT onto Rt 26 North for approx. 13.8 miles.
- ► At the blinking yellow light (beyond Marklesburg NOT at Entriken), turn RIGHT onto Seven Points Road.
- ► Approximately 5.4 miles, turn RIGHT into marina parking area.
- ▶ Park in the closest parking space to the lake (Handicap spaces are available). Get tickets at counter inside marina store. Tell them you are with the Hollidaysburg Class of '53 group.

Cruise along the shores and view the red shale outcrops which add to the beauty of the lake with the red cedar trees always present.
